

# **4H Discover 4H**

(Proposed Structure)

## **Project Workshop Sessions**

When: Sat. morning and/or afternoon on day of event  
(a few hours break at noontime)

Audience: Participants are primarily current 4-Hers

Time: 1 hr sessions or 2 hr session (as project needs) plus prep time

### ➤ Project Workshops

If you have led projects on previous Project Days, we would encourage you to consider leading a project in your area of interest. If you have not previously led a project at Project Day, but would like to do so now, new projects are also welcome. These project sessions will be for current 4-H members.

- ✓ On the survey, sign up if you are willing to lead a project workshop.

## **Hands on Exhibits/Booths**

When: Sat. late morning to early afternoon (around noontime) on day of event  
(between Project Workshop Sessions)

Audience: open to the community and 4-Hers

Time: Around 3 hrs plus prep time

### ➤ Club Booths

If you are a 4-H Club leader, consider your club participating with a table top display of past projects, community service, a hands-on activity, and/or other material to showcase your club and its special feel. An area that involves the visitors with something intriguing, an activity, and/or conversation is beneficial. Let new people learn about your club and how they can join.

- ✓ On the survey, sign up if your club is willing to have a club booth.

### ➤ Project Booths

If you are a project leader, we would like you to have an area showcasing your project. If possible, have a low-cost, hands-on project for anyone who stops by.

Examples:

Stamping cards/bookmarks	Photography set-up for stills to be taken
Latch hooking a few squares	Basket weaving and re-doing a small section
Horticulture planting seeds/seedlings	Model Railroad Set-Up and/or activity
Embroidery – teach stitches	FIRST LEGO League table
Pottery – practice pinch pots	Bicycle Rodeo sample course (outside activity)
Dog Obedience – demonstrations (outside activity)	
Horses – video of past events, schedules of future shows	
Knitting – knit a few rows	Clowning –make-up; balloon animals
Drama – drama games	Others... - you get the idea!

- ✓ On the survey, sign up if you are willing to have a project booth.

➤ **Committee/Activity Booths**

If you are a committee or activity leader, we would like you to consider having a table top display informing members and their parents about your committee. Attention-getting visuals and something hands-on may be beneficial. Many 4-Hers are unaware of opportunities to grow, learn, and serve with the committees. Many know little about the activities of camp, trips, etc. that are available to them through 4-H.

Examples:

Kitchen Committee –showing experience and job skills gained through serving, maybe youth telling what they did

Awards Committee – Sample record books (maybe 3<sup>rd</sup> grader's and high schooler's); photos of youth on trips they received through awards; maybe excited youth telling of their experiences

Council of Teens - photos of events; youth telling what it is; schedules of coming events

Others...

**Performances**

When: Sat. late morning to early afternoon (around noontime) on day of event  
(between Project Workshop Sessions)

Audience: open to the community and 4-Hers

Time: Performance time plus prep time – maybe being available for questions

➤ **On Stage Events**

If your club has members who might be interested in performing their drama, dance, declamation, or instrument solo (maybe from last year's Curtain Call and/or Showcase), we would like to have a sample of this aspect of 4-H to show others.

Examples:

LaTEENo Dancers

Cloggers

Curtain Call performances

Declamation/Dramatic Reading

Instrumental solos or small group
